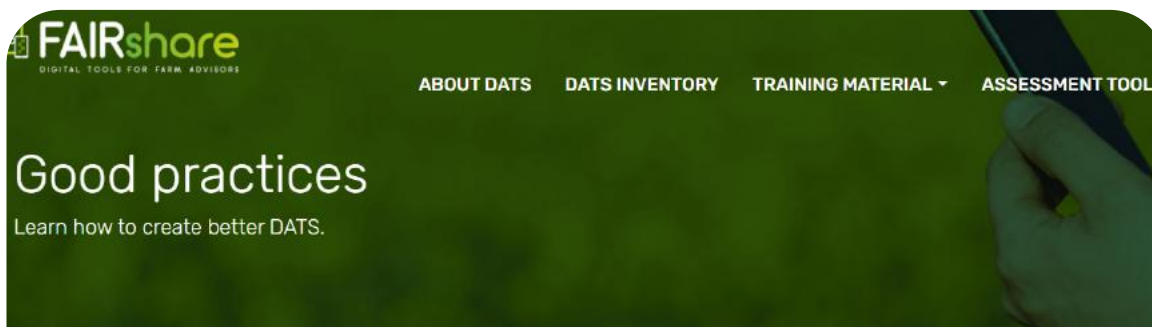

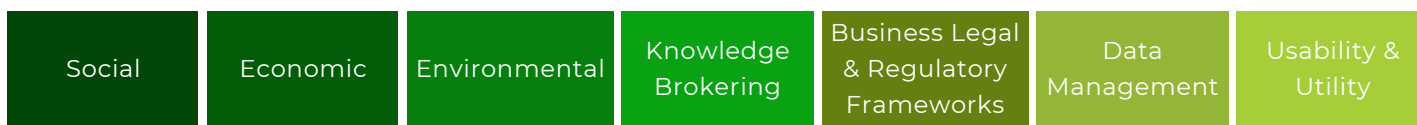

Context

The objective of Deliverable 2.1. is to present the central deliberations underpinning the identification of DATS 'Good Practices' in an attempt to balance the goals of:

- Identifying consistent criteria for recognising Good Practices across different contexts/countries and
- Illuminating practices that are 'good' in ways that are actor and context specific, but which may nonetheless be transferable/adapted for transferability to other contexts.

D2.1 outlines how Hot Topics (key themes) are suggested by the European Network for Rural Development (ENRD) as particularly useful thematically organising Good Practices. In total 7 parent Hot Topic categories captured the key themes related to DATS:



The framework therefore enables end-users to identify Good Practices and having done so allows them to taxonomise Good Practices according to Hot Topics relevant to DATS.

Recommendations

- Provide an understanding of what Good Practices mean and why they are important
- Describe the process of defining the who, why, what, where, and how that captures the end user's needs.
